Librarian's Report

New Clerk – we're happy to welcome Elizabeth Padgett to the team! She brings a background in horticulture, speaks Spanish, and formally worked as a clerk in Buffalo.

Storywalk and Book Giveaway – held on Sept 24, set up our tent concurrently with the farmer's market and gave away books, while also putting up book pages throughout the common so that folks can read a children's book as they walk. Massive PR success, with many folks saying they'd never seen such a thing, and being blown away at the idea of getting free books for their children. Books that would otherwise gather dust get a good home, we support literacy in the community, everybody wins.

Book Sale – went very well! It was a very effective idea to extend for an additional week, and having the "buy a bag" available meant we were able to clear out a large number of mass market paperbacks that would otherwise have gathered dust. Backroom has about $1/3^{\rm rd}$ of the books it used to, and is navigable again. Made about \$400 total, so overall an excellent event.

Feeding Fredonia Challenge – participating along with many other small businesses in town. Runs October 9-21 by the Fredonia Food Pantry of the Fredonia Presbyterian Church.

Friends – met with the Friends on Saturday 10/15. Their annual meeting is Saturday November 12th at 10 am. They agreed to purchase for us many items that were on our wish list, for which we thank them!

Exhibits

• Outdoor pop-up table displays about the Victorian-era mourning customs and various "haunted" locations around Pomfret will be highlighted; and a temporary halloween exhibit about funeral practices from the early 1900s is being installed in conjunction with the Harvest Festival on October 21st and 22nd.

Collections Management

• Archives intern Erin has finished cataloging several sections of the village documents, including the police and fire records. This project is anticipated to be completed by December 20th.

Programs

- "Frights at the Museum" program is set to take place on Oct. 22nd from 6-7:30.
- Christmas Caroling to be sponsored by the museum on Dec. 17th at 4:30 (just before sunset at 4:45); carol for an hour, return about 5:45 for cider, hot cocoa, cookies. They requested and were granted the use of images for use in an episode of Chronicles, which discusses prohibition, airing on TV on Thursday Oct 20th at 8pm.
