# Archives

- The archives were busy this year. Highlights include: 11 collections processed, 3 projects managed and supervised, 2 grant applications submitted, and 1 event planned/implemented.
- The website has been updated to include an 'Archives' page. This page currently has three finding aids available (with more to come!), and a form to submit research requests. This research request form streamlines the request process, ensures all requests are addressed, and allows me to collect valuable data to use on grant applications and end-of-year reports.
- Intern Erin Hibbert is continuing her work with the Village Papers Collection. Currently, the collection is 80% processed and the finding aid is 50% completed; the collection will be available for research in the next two months.

## Programs

• The Christmas Caroling program was sponsored by the museum during the Open House on December 17. We had about 30 participants, and we marched around Barker Commons starting at 4:30. Refreshments of cookies, coffee, and hot chocolate were made available from funds granted by the Friends.

Outreach

- On December 13, we had 27 of our paintings and large-format images photographed by Pat Stokes, for the creation of fine art prints to be made available for sale. The photographed subjects include the Examination of a Witch, paintings of the Commons in 1860 and 1977, the 1875 Sanborn Map, and Alvah Bradish portraits.
