## **Curator's Report**

### Archives

- A collection database software called Omeka has been selected to house the digital Grape Belt Archive. It is a free (aside from the need for a server at the cost of \$100 per year) and open-source collection management software, managed by non-profit Corporation for Digital Scholarship. Next steps involve finalizing the purchase of a server on a new computer. Once it is set up, the Grape Belt, which is a digital archive, will be uploaded, and then metadata will be manually input. When completed, the archive will be publicly accessible through the Barker's web portal.
  - <u>The Grape Belt Archive</u> is composed of postcards, rare images, ephemera, agricultural catalogs, pamphlets, and photocopies of reference materials including biographies, academic journals, booklets, newspapers, correspondences, and research notes. The collection of materials relate to industries in Pomfret and throughout the southern shore of Lake Erie.
- Omeka was selected above several other collection software systems due to its low cost, its compatibility with established library cataloging standards, and its ability to create digital exhibits. The archive will be free in its entirety.

# **Programs**

- Corresponding with management of the Opera House to explore the possibility of programs around their county history series. Tentatively planning the August author's talk, to be given by Rick Barram (author

- of Dear Uncles: The Civil War Letters of Arthur McKinstry and The 72nd New York Infantry in the Civil War).
- Dr. Thomas Reigstad is all set to give a presentation about his book, *Scribblin' for a Livin': Mark Twain's Pivotal Period in Buffalo*, on February 4 at noon. Reception will follow his talk.

### Outreach

- Four clubs (Shakespeare, Rotary, Antique, and Genealogy) have been invited to the Barker to host a meeting and receive a group tour of the new exhibit. Letter also invited them to the upcoming author presentation.
- Met with a reporter from the Observer and interviewed for an upcoming piece in the newspaper about the Mark Twain exhibit and upcoming programs.
- Barker Museum was on the front page of the Observer's year-end paper.

# Acquisitions

- Bob Booth will donate materials from his work restoring the Mark Fountains in Barker Common in 1991 and 1999. The donation is composed of news articles, contracts, spare casting pieces including molds, and original zinc pieces from the Mark Fountains.
- Donation of over 50 artifacts including advertisements, postcards, photos, and correspondences from local businesses and people between 1870s-1940s, from collector Vince Martonis.
