Curator's Report

Archives

- New computer and dual monitor set-up received from the library system. Mike Jones, IT manager for the library system, also was instrumental in getting Omeka S set up for hosting the Grape Belt Archive online. There is nothing uploaded yet, but for those interested the link is https://barkerarchive.cclsny.org/. Big thanks to Graham and the people at the library system for all their help!
- Catherine is processing the Grape Belt files, documenting and describing each file as well as determining the ones appropriate for uploading to the Omeka site. She is also continuing work on the Financial section of the village papers.
- Village Papers are 90% complete. Erin comes in twice a month to continue her work. She is wrapping up the last two series and adding tissue paper between all files to help with preservation.

Programs

- Dr. Thomas Reigstad gave a presentation about his book, Scribblin' for a Livin': Mark Twain's Pivotal Period in Buffalo, on February 4. 35 people were in attendance.

Outreach

- Coordination with Opera House on history series continues with two confirmed dates; Rick Barram, author of Dear Uncles: The Civil War Letters of Arthur McKinstry (and The 72nd New York Infantry in the Civil War), will give a talk on August 17, and Dr. Cathy Ullman will present her research into funerary practices on September 7, at 7:00 at the Opera House—much of her research was conducted at the Barker Museum.

- Barker Museum was on the front page of the Observer on February 8th. Two new prospective volunteers have written to show interest after the article was published.
- Number of research requests in the last month: 8. These include property histories and genealogy requests, as well as information about primary sources about the gas well, Forest Hill, and the Fredonia Academy.
