## **Curator's Report**

### Outreach

- Our new book, "The Fair Chambered Corridor: Explorations of the History of Fredonia, NY" is an edited collection of articles written over the course of three decades by historian and former researcher Doug Shepard. The book has been published and ordered, printed copies of which will arrive August 22-24. Paperback copies will be sold at the book launch on Sept 16, after which they will be sold both online and at the museum.
- Fredonia Recreation Department visits resulted in visits by 41 students who engaged with our educational program on printing. Using movable type, they printed name tags for themselves and had a 30-minute tour of the exhibits.

## **Building Maintenance**


