Outreach

- Krystyna Klos's internship program, "Blue Devils, Pink Rink," about the history of local hockey, including a display, a create-your-own hockey team, a scavenger hunt, and a guess the penalty challenge. Attendance: 7
- Jack Foreman's internship program, "Historical Fredonia Goes Digital," was completed with a digital recreation of the Fredonia that the Marquis de Lafayette would have encountered in 1825 on his tour across America. Building exteriors and interiors were modeled according to paintings, photographs, floor plans, and written record. The project overall contains six building lots, including the Darwin R. Barker Museum, Fredonia Academy, and Baptist Church. Each lot includes a brief historical background in its description. 32 downloads and a total of 39 interactions.
